Voter Approved Community Investment

In spring 2021, crews will break ground on the New Science Building (NSB) on the college's Verdugo Campus. Approved by Glendale voters; funded by Glendale property taxes, the five-story structure will feature specialized state-of-the-art teaching and laboratory spaces to help meet the demand for instruction in the biological and physical sciences.

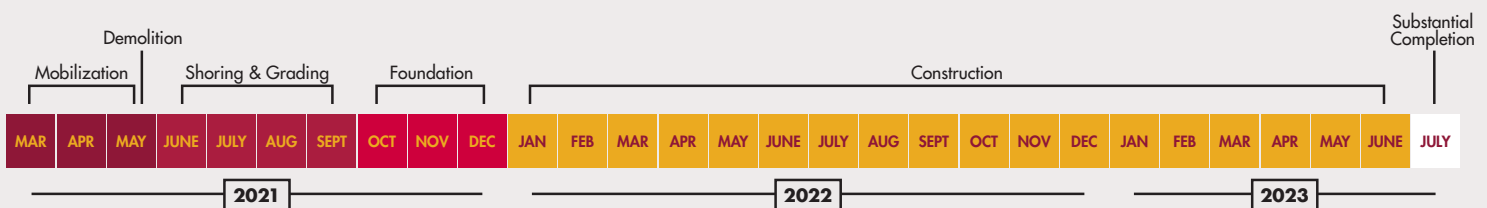

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: HOW LONG WILL THE BUILDING PROCESS LAST?

A: Demolition work is scheduled to begin in May 2021 with construction continuing through mid-2023. Barring unforeseen conditions, substantial completion of the building is scheduled for July 2023, and ready to welcome students by Fall 2023.

Q: WHO APPROVED THIS PROJECT?

A: The GCC Board of Trustees approved the project. The college sits on state land as part of California's Community College System. Therefore, the design was approved by the Division of the State Architect under the Department of General Services. Although the City of Glendale has no jurisdiction over this project, GCC is working with the City's Public Works Department to mitigate any inconveniences to nearby residents and businesses during the construction process.

Q: WHO IS PAYING FOR THE BUILDING?

A: In 2016, an overwhelming majority (73%) of Glendale voters approved Measure GC, a \$325 million bond program to enable GCC to upgrade educational facilities at the Verdugo, Garfield and Montrose Campuses. A citizens' bond oversight committee comprised of a diverse representation of Glendale community members meets quarterly to ensure that the bond funds are spent appropriately and in a timely manner.
